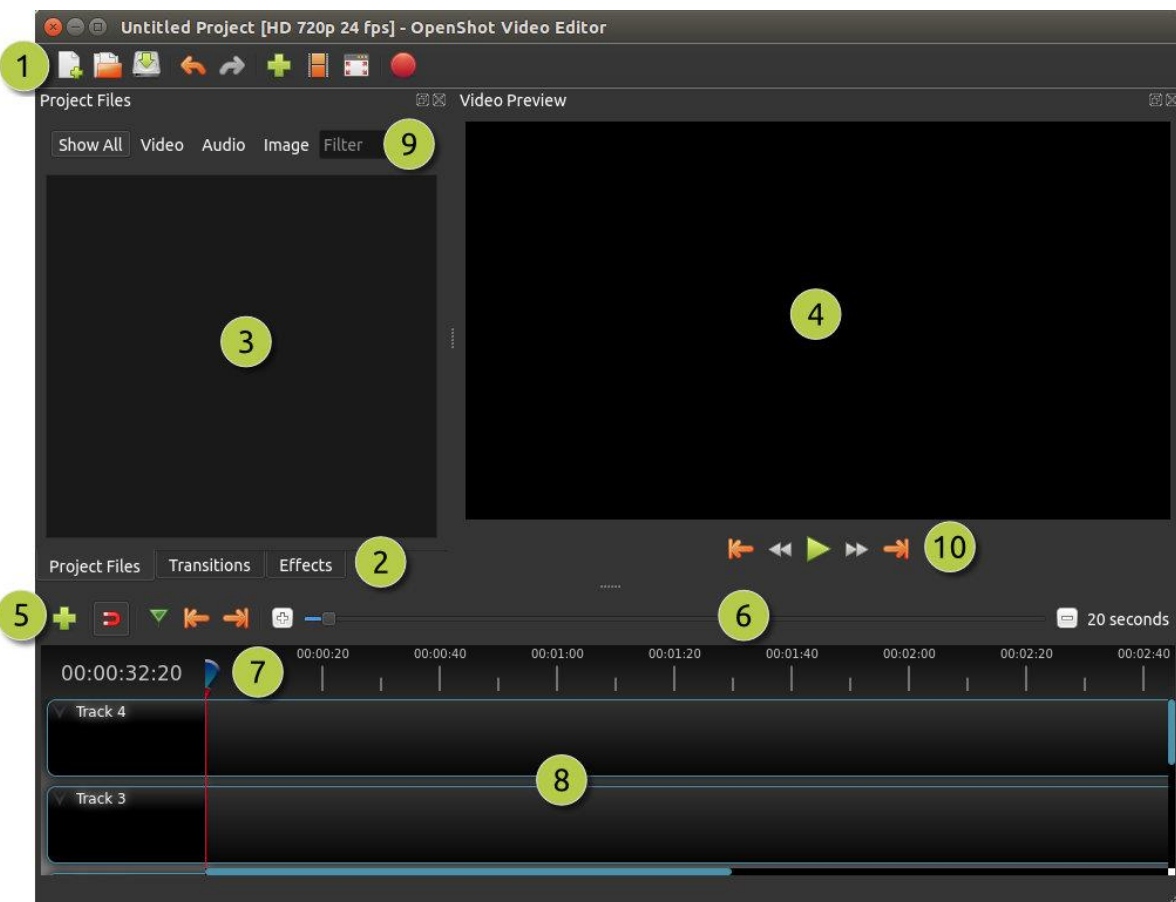


Year 9 – HT1 – Sound and Video Editing

Keywords:

Timeline	a chronological sequence of events along a given timeframe
Import	The process of moving files used in one program to another
Voiceover	the voice of an unseen person recorded over a movie or video using video editing software
Audio effect	Audio effects are designed to manipulate sound
Fade in/fade out	a transition effect where the image slowly appears/disappears
Reverb	an electronically produced echo effect
Compression	the process of modifying, encoding or converting the bits structure of data in such a way that it consumes less space on disk
Soundtrack	The audio that is recorded on movie film, a video or game
Export	to convert a file into another format than the one it is currently in
Visual effect	a special effect that is added to a film or video in post-production
Transition	a visual effect that happens between each photo, slide, or video clip
Titles	Text that appears in a video clip

#	Name	Description
1	Main Toolbar	Contains buttons to open, save, and export your video project.
2	Function Tabs	Switch between Project Files, Transitions, and Effects.
3	Project Files	All audio, video, and image files that have been imported into your project.
4	Preview Window	This is the area that the video will playback on the screen.
5	Edit Toolbar	This toolbar contains buttons used for snapping, inserting markers, and jumping between markers.
6	Zoom Slider	This slider will adjust the time-scale of your timeline.
7	Play-head / Ruler	The ruler shows the time-scale, and the red line is the play-head. The play-head represents the current playback position.
8	Timeline	The timeline visualizes your video project, and each clip and transition in your project.
9	Filter	Filter the list of items shown (project files, transitions, and effects) by using these buttons and filter textbox. Enter a few letters of what you are looking for, and the results will be shown.
10	Playback	Left to Right: Jump to Start, Rewind, Play/Pause, Fast Forward, and Jump to End
