Areas of Development

<p>Some students must apply themselves/put in more effort rather than being too relaxed about learning /too lazy to revise outside of lesson.</p>	<p>More practice, particularly with peers, ought to be performed by the students.</p> <p>Vocabulary MUST be revised more regularly between each lesson as repetition of vocab is key. This often involves no work. The sentence/word simply needs to be verbally repeated/used from time to time.</p>
How can you support your child at home?	
<p>You can best support your child by supervising them loudly reading over their lesson, even if just once on a weekend, and then using the vocab they learn at school (which can be found in the booklet/start of each lesson in exercise books) in order to get them more accustomed to the word. This will also assist them in remembering the word.</p> <p>Please ensure they complete their homework which is often only 15/20mins per week and extremely useful in ensuring what they learn is retained.</p> <p>Encourage them to use the Arabic they learn in daily life as much as possible, and you'll find yourself learning some unintentionally too!</p>
