
Three main causes of conflict:

Psychological: many psychologists hold the view that as man has got the fighting instinct so conflict is inevitable.

Economic: Sometimes economic factors contribute to the development of friction or the outbreak of conflict among states. The pursuit of economic objectives both abroad and at home contributes to war

Cultural and Ideological: a

divergence of views and values among the members of a society constitutes an actual or potential source of conflict and increases the difficulty of settling disputes peacefully



One conflict example- Coltan in the Democratic Republic of Congo

The UN has claimed that all the parties involved in the local civil war have been involved in the mining and sale of Coltan. One report suggested that the neighboring Rwandan army made US\$250 million from selling Coltan in less than 18 months, despite there being no Coltan in Rwanda to mine. The military forces of Uganda and Burundi are also implicated in smuggling Coltan out of Congo for resale in Belgium.

Yhe United Nations security council has called for a stop on all payments and imports of Coltan from the Democratic Republic of Congo, due to the ongoing civil war that has dragged in the surrounding countries.

80% of the world's known coltan supply is in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, which the UN says is subject to "highly organized and systematic exploitation.
